Clifty Falls State Park



Visit Clifty Falls. This waterfall is 60 feet tall. How much taller than you is the waterfall? Draw a picture of Clifty Falls, and a picture of yourself next to the waterfall. Write down your height next to you, and Clifty Falls' height next to it as a diagram to show the difference.



















Clifty Falls State Park

Observe the birds at the feeders at the Nature Center or Clifty Inn. What color birds do you see? Try and draw three birds that you see and write the list of colors you see next to each bird.



Heritage Park

Use your senses to observe (look, listen, smell, etc.) the Ohio River. What kind of animals do you think live in the river? What animals may live beside the river's edge. Write a list, or draw pictures of the types of animals you think make the Ohio River and its shores home.





















Heritage Trail



People like to walk on this trail – and lots of animals visit this park too! Make up a story about the animals who live beside the creek and in this steep forest and write it down on this page!





















Webster Woods Nature Preserve



Park at the Church. Walk down the gravel road, to the east, to find the walking trail. Look for wildflowers along the trail and write down what colors they are.

This nature preserve is home to lots of frogs! If you notice any small ponds, go look for frog eggs. Frog eggs are in gooey clumps floating in the water. Draw one of the gooey clumps of frog eggs you see in the space below.
























Bicentennial Park



What type of animal do you see in the bench next to the entrance arch?

When the park floods during heavy rains, it can bring trash for up river. Look around for litter, then lend a hand and pick up some of the trash and recycle, or dispose of it properly.





















Hanover College Trails



Do you see any flowers blooming along the trail? What kind of animals do you think depend on those flowers to survive. Write down a list of animals you think might need wildflowers to survive, and draw a picture of one of them in the space below.

Stop right where you are for a few minutes and be absolutely silent. What kinds of sounds do you hear? Write down what you were able to hear.






















Gaines Park

There are many areas to play different sports at this park. What is you favorite sport you like to play here? Draw a picture of something from the sport you picked in the space below.






















Hargan-Matthews Park

What animals, plants, or insects do you see on the lake trail? Can draw one in the space below?






















Jaycee's Park

Do you see any real birds? Tell a story about why they are visiting the park today.






















John Paul Park

What kinds of birds and other animals do you see or hear? Name at least two, and write their names in the space below.






















Lorenz Park
